Note to all NBAL Members

Below are changes to NBAL Gallery Rules regarding membership fees and studio fees. After the NBAL budget was reviewed by the Executive Board, it was decided that it was time to discuss raising the membership and studio fees with our Team Board so we could get their input before any changes were made. Our number of visitors and money transactions/intake at the docent desk (Sales, Fees,& Donations) are a little better than last year, 2022 Jan to July 5,820 visitors/\$56,106.47 intake, compared to 2023 Jan to July 6,602 visitors/\$56,851.67 intake. Unfortunately, the cost of living has gone up and we fear it will continue to rise in the upcoming election year. We are seeing a noted increase in the cost of utilities, paper products, drinks, ink, paper, and printing, which we use a lot of.

At the Team Board meeting we all agreed to tighten our belts and make some changes.

- 1. We will be phasing out our **thank you cards** and replacing them with a **postcard** that will be put directly into the customer's hand/bag. This will save us printing, envelopes, and postage.
- 2. Water and sodas will now be \$1.
- 3. Submission fees for special shows will be raised starting 2024 by \$5 each entry. Next year they will be \$25 (1), \$30 (2), and \$35 (3).
- 4. Studio fees will be raised in 2024 from \$4 to \$5 per student for use of the studio/classrooms.
- Starting this October for 2024 membership... NBAL Membership will go from \$35 to \$40 for next year, Display Fee will go from \$35 to \$40 for next year.

Total for General Membership \$40 & Total for Displaying Membership \$80. These changes were voted on by the Executive and Team Board with all in agreement.

What can you do to help? The best way you can help us is to watch our energy output. Please double check that all the lights are off when you leave, fans are off and thermostats set at the correct settings. Please continue to document our visitors and money intake on the log sheets so that I can continue to gather those numbers for the future.

What I plan in the future: I plan to meet with Vicki Houston, Joe Eby, and Vicki Smith to see if we can change, shorten, or cut out some of the paperwork we use at the docent desk and in the gallery. WE USE A LOT OF PAPER, and I would like to see if we can change that so please bear with me as I try to figure it out. If anyone has suggestions, please email me.

Docent Training

Joe Eby sent out a letter reminding us to double check our work and math at the docent desk. These little mistakes add up and make our Finance Team crazy!

- 1. Fill out the entire sales receipt/invoice.
- 2. Fill in all the blanks on the Daily Sales Log.
- 3. Use the tax chart (it is on the desk) to figure out the tax on each item.
- 4. Use the calculator to do the math.
- 5. Count the change box at the beginning of your shift and at the end... If you do this, you will catch any mistakes that may have been made with cash.
- Look at the notebook with the CLOVER credit card machine information if you have any questions. Changing the paper... look how the old roll is in the machine before you pull it out and try to put the new roll in.
- 7. Look at the Daily Sales Log notebook, located behind the wrapping table, next to the docent work desk to see your team's and other's past log sheets. If you see any mistakes marked in red, then you will be more likely to remember it next time. Also, it is good to see what art is selling and the price it was sold for.

Artists, *PLEASE* watch your handwriting when filling out your Artist Inventory Sheet and your Artists' Cards on your artwork... your 5 may look like a 6 to the rest of us!
