Please complete your daily sales log entirely. All data needs to be entered and totaled.

Please complete the sales invoice completely. Dollar figures should be written with a decimal point to avoid careless errors. i.e. \$57.00 NOT 57.

You MUST submit a <u>signed</u> charge slip for every charged purchase. The customer keeps the copy without a signature line. NBAL retains the signed receipt.

Ornament sales are a fundraiser for NBAL. The "artist" on the sales invoice is NBAL.

#### **Note to all Docents**

We are phasing out the DOCENT DAILY CHECK SHEET! After we have used the ones we have already printed, we will change over to a new Daily Sales Log/Check sheet combo. This will save us the printing of a two-sided form that is used every day as a reminder for the docents and then thrown away. I have taken the main items from our old check sheet and put them on the back of the Sales Log so that all the important money documentation and docent tasks that are done for the running of the gallery are on one sheet. This way there will be a record of how well your docent team did for the day on hand for you and your team to see. It would be good to start looking at the old Daily Sales Logs in the notebook behind the wrapping table to check how well your team is doing. You will see any mistakes or items missing marked in red. *PLEASE*, do not take this as a reprimand but as a note to what to double check as you work at the desk the next time.

DOCENT HELPFUL REMINDER will be on the docent desk as a reminder on how to write a sale, handle artwork sold, and docent tasks for maintaining gallery appearance. This will stay at the desk and should be referred to every day.

The Docent Desk Reference Notebook has been updated...... Please take the time to take a look at it as you work at the Docent Desk.

#### **Docent Training**

**GENERAL MEMBERS...** If you would like to help the gallery out by working at the Docent Desk or you would like to make some extra money by being a Docent Substitute (\$40 for the day), then you need to be trained. The training will be on Dec. 9, and there will be two

sessions from 9 to 12 noon *OR* 1 to 4 pm. Please contact **Joe Eby** to let him know you are coming.

#### **Gallery Staffing**

**Vicki Smith** and I are working hard to get the Schedule and Calendars out to you as soon as they are completed. We will send them to you for proofing before we go to print.

**PLEASE** remember to fill out your sub information on your new Timesheets when you get them in January. It would help everyone if you at least marked the day of the week that you work as a day you would trade and be a sub.

### **Gallery Appearance/Display**

**Gina Cumberland**, who does a fantastic job at keeping our gallery looking beautiful, asked me to pass along a couple of messages to the docents. First, a big **THANK YOU** to all the wonderful docents who have helped her rehang the artwork when she comes in. She told me she could not do her job without you. Second, as you walk around the gallery, please look for any open spots that are there from artwork being removed or sold and shift the artwork around to fill it in.

Gina's message to displaying members: When you are submitting or displaying art at the gallery, you may hang your piece in any available space or if there isn't any space, hang it down low on the wall and she will make a place for it. If it's a larger piece, you may place it on an easel in the side gallery but be sure to not block others art pieces. Easels are stored by the elevator. If there's an easel in the side gallery with a piece of unframed art, you may return the piece to the bin and use the easel.

#### Team Leader Position that needs to be filled:

**Special Events/Demonstrations Team Leader\*** – Oversees special events such as Wine & Saengerfest, Wine Stroll, and Wassailfest. Coordinates the staffing for the events. Schedules and manages artist demonstrations or programs planned for the General Meetings throughout the year. This job is perfect for the person who likes to showcase different artists and their talents.

#### Team Position that needs to be filled:

Cleaning or Maintenance Team Members — This job is perfect for those who work a full-time job because the workers can set their own hours to come into the gallery to work. Team members will have 2 work dates in each month and will need to also sign the Housekeeping check off list. (2 Slots)

**Next Show is "2023 Artist of the Year".** Submission day is Tuesday, Jan. 2, 2024. Eligible artists were winners (Best of Show, 1<sup>st</sup>, 2<sup>nd</sup>, or 3<sup>rd</sup> place) in a special show in 2023 and paid 2023 membership fees by 12/31/2022. Eligible artists have been notified by e-mail.

Please pay your membership dues for 2024 now. In order to be eligible for next year's Artist of the Year special show you must win Best of Show, 1st, 2nd, or 3rd place in a 2024 show AND must have paid your dues by 12/31/2023.

After members voiced their opinions, about half wanted to continue to receive award ribbons and half thought ribbons were not needed for special show winners. So, we decided that each artist can decide whether to keep the award ribbon or choose to give it back for use at another show. If you choose not to keep the award ribbon, simply leave it at the docent desk when you pick up your art at the end of the show.

**2024 Special Show Schedule** will be available on the Special Show bulletin board soon. There will be some returning shows by member request including "All Creatures Great and Small", "Piece by Piece", and "Art of Photography" along with many of the regular show themes.

By member request, special show receptions will be shortened in 2024. Friday receptions will be from 6 – 7:30pm with awards announced at 7pm and Sunday receptions will be from 2-3:30pm with awards announced at 3pm.


