Q: How do I know when I need to change the paper on the Clover machine?

A: When the receipt coming out of the Clover has a red/pink ink stain down the middle, it is time. That is your warning. The Clover will not print if it is out of paper. (Please do NOT replace the paper until you see the red streak.)

Please remember that part of the closing duties for the docent team is to ensure that ALL thermostats have been set correctly for overnight. Please look whether the unit is on "heat" or "cool.' When heating, thermostats are kept at 70 while the gallery is open and 65 when the gallery closes. When cooling, thermostats are at 75 when the gallery is open and 80 when we close at night. This is an easy way for NBAL to conserve energy as well as reduce our utility cost.

Part of the job description for the finance team includes collecting the funds left in the drink jars and donation jar. Docents should NOT be collecting the donation jar money.

Note to all NBAL Members

Below are the two newest changes to NBAL Gallery Rules. I know it is just now March, but we have found two rules that needed to be altered by just a few important words. You can also find these posted at the back of the Docent Reference Notebook.

DISPLAY CRITERIA FOR MAIN GALLERY AND SPECIAL SHOWS

Gallery Rules section 7, General Rules, page 18.

Artwork left by an artist a member whose membership has expired by 90 days or longer shall be considered abandoned and become the property of the Gallery for disposal at the sole discretion of the Board with no obligation to the artist.

Gallery Rules section 7, Display Requirements, page 22.

d. Use of Plexiglas in lieu of glass is encouraged for works larger than 16"x20" because of the weight of the work. Plexiglas is required on works 24"x36" or larger. Pastel and charcoal works are exempt due to the static electric charge of Plexiglas but must not weigh more than the 15 pounds weight restriction.

This means that the focus will be on the weight of the artwork not size to determine if Plexiglas is required.
