Docents are reminded to look at the credit card receipt to determine the method of payment. DEBIT means the payment was made by debit card and "debit" should be circled on the sales invoice.

Even if a charge payment is made by a touchless method, docents are expected to print out a receipt for the customer to sign and print a receipt to give to the customer. Follow the prompts on the screen. A signature line will not be printed on the receipt.

Note to all NBAL Members:

Below are changes to NBAL Gallery Rules regarding Docent workdays and substitutes.

Approved 8/15/23: (*Referencing pages 11 – 12, Gallery Rules section 5, Docents*)

5. WORK SCHEDULES FOR DISPLAYING MEMBERS AND GENERAL MEMBER VOLUNTEERS

Docents

- a. Gallery hours are Monday through Saturday, 10:00 AM to 5:00 PM. Sunday hours are 12:00 noon to 5:00 PM. The gallery will close for New Year's Day, Easter, July 4th, Thanksgiving, and Christmas Day. Gallery closes at 3pm on Christmas Eve and New Year's Eve. Docents are to arrive fifteen minutes prior to opening and stay until the closing checklist is complete.
- b. Docents work scheduled days twelve times a year.
 - (1) If a docent knows ahead of time that they are unable to work on their scheduled day, they must find a substitute. There are two substitute lists to help with finding replacements, Docents who will trade days and Docents who will work for the fee of \$40. Docents must call these subs first. <u>Regardless of any arrangements</u> <u>made</u>, the originally scheduled Docent is ultimately held responsible for staffing <u>the workday</u>.
 - (2) If no substitute can be found from the lists, then the Docent will contact the 1st VP by email, and they will post a request through the email system to all the NBAL members. In your email request, please include your phone number(s) and the date you are scheduled to work and need a sub. If there are specific days you can only work on, please include those. If anyone is interested—they will contact you directly, via email or phone(s), and the two of you will make the arrangements. It is then up to them to fulfill their arrangement. The 1st VP will not be responsible for any action after that, such as scheduling, etc.
 - (3) In an emergency situation, the Docent will call the Gallery Staffing Team Leader; an emergency situation is when something happens the day of your scheduled workday, i.e., you wake up sick or are in an accident. In other words, this should only be happening once or twice a year. Gallery Staffing has a list that they will call to fill in for you. <u>You WILL have to make up for this missed day by the end of the year. Contact Gallery Staffing to see where you are needed</u>.
- c. Docents who miss a day due to a holiday, or when the Gallery is closed because of bad weather will need to make it up. The Gallery Staffing Team Leader will keep a list of these docents and will use these docents on an <u>Emergency Call/Email List</u>. If you are on this list, please respond as soon as possible when the Gallery Staffing person contacts you so that you can take care of making up your workday.

Checking Cash:

A marker for checking that cash is not a forgery is now found *(or as soon as it gets here)* in the Change Box. Chase Miles Willet, who is our Assistant Treasurer and works in a bank, says that the pens are not always accurate and that the best way for us to be sure is to **KNOW YOUR MONEY**. He has provided us with a handout that shows you what to look for when accepting large bills. This handout will be on top of the change box for you and your team to review and refer to when needed. A copy will also be in the Docent Desk Reference Notebook.

Starting September 1, we will switch to the new THANK YOU POSTCARDS. Please be sure to put a Thank You Postcard in with any artwork sold. This will save us printing, envelopes, and postage.


